Jail Chaplains; Lives being Repurposed

The Cass County Jail is a mission field within our community. Jail Chaplains is the sending organization. Chaplain Mike Sonju & a team of 30 volunteers are the messengers. Kathy Spriggs & Kathy Mitchell are the hands & feet of Jesus each Monday morning at 8:30 a.m.

11,503 attended Jail Chaplain programs
(# of times a person, not unique individuals heard the gospel)
1,652 hours volunteers invested sharing Jesus
(equals 41 work weeks at 40 hours each)

Jail Chaplains sponsored a conversation for the Faith Community with the Leadership of Law Enforcement in late August. Every faith community in the Fargo Moorhead community was invited to attend. One hundred and thirty people packed the meeting room representing forty-seven faith communities. US Attorney Chris Myers opened the conversation and boldly told the faith community their support and engagement is critical to address the opioid use resulting in the epidemic of deaths in our community. Myer's went on to say, "The faith community should be an extension of the family nucleus. If they don't have a healthy family the faith community can their support."

The Cass County Jail Administration tell us 85-90% of the men and women who pass through the jail are there because of an addiction. They are using, using & dealing or have committed a crime to support their habit. This means the Jail Chaplains team are primarily ministering to individuals impacted by addiction. Our ministry is connected with eighteen churches who support us financially, with prayer and/or are the home congregation of one of our team members.

Calvary church family, thank you again for your partnership with Jail Chaplains. Together we are pointing people to Jesus and encouraging them to grow in their personal relationship with Him. In 2017, you will see Jail Chaplains continue to encourage faith communities to engage individuals battling addiction and their families. We will be tireless in shining the light of Jesus into the dark places. Jesus saves and breaks the chains of sin! Please us prayer for the men & women passing through the jail asking the Holy Spirit to draw them close.
