WHAT IS VISION?	
Vision (Merriam Webster): (1) something seen in a dream, trance, or ecstasy especially: a supernatural appearance that conveys a revelation; (2) a thought, concept, or object formed by the imagination; (3) a manifestation to the senses of something	
immaterial	

WHAT IS VISION?	
Haxon (Strong's Concordance): a sight (mentally),	
i.e. a dream, revelation, or oracle:—vision.	
WHAT IS VISION?	
Vision (Pastor's Definition): A vividly clear picture	
of a desired end state. For Christians, it comes directly from God and communicates His desire for	
an individual, institution, organization, or a nation.	
"The capacity to see the invisible and see that it is possible." Dr. Myles Munroe	
TYPES OF VISION	
Vision:	
(1) Internal Vision - God works through our natural	
experiences to communicate his will. He uses our own internal voice/thoughts and senses. It typically	
requires discernment with other sources (bible,	
elders, friends, etc.). This is the most common experience.	

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TYPES OF VISION	
Vision:	
(2) Trance or "In the Spirit" — Out of body, supernatural experience.	
— Rev. 1:10, 4:2 (John in the Spirit); — 2 Cor. 12:2 (A man in the 3rd heaven)	
TYPES OF VISION	
Vision:	
(3) Open Vision - Comes from God and shown as pictures or a movie. A voice may or may not accompany it. The visual and the voice are distinctly separate from our own internal voice.	
— Isaiah 6 (The prophet Isaiah sees God)	
VISION & THE 5-FOLD MINISTRY	
Vision, seeing God's desired end state, is a	
prophetic gift. Foresight, seeing how to achieve God's end state, is an apostolic or prophetic gift.	
Vision is not a pastoral gift. Yet, pastors are	
expected to lead and operate with vision. This is why most churches are person-centered	
(personality-driven) rather than God-centered	
(prophecy-driven).

HOW DOES VISION WORK FOR THE CHURCH?	
The vision comes from God, and usually to one person (prophet, apostle, etc.). Typically in a church, it is the person God given the spiritual charge of a congregation. This is normally the (lead/senior) pastor.	
Vision can be achieved through delegation to another person with the prophetic or visionary gift; or as a corporate body (less common).	
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VISION CHECKS & BALANCES	
The vision, when possible, should be validated by other trusted leaders and/or spiritually mature congregants based on the church's governance. However, agreement or disagreement does not prove if a vision (or leadership direction) is or is not from God. Test the spirit (1 John 4:1).

Ephesians 4:3-6

through all and in all.
