


Obey -

- (1) to follow the commands or guidance of;
- (2) to conform to or comply with

Obey VS Honor

Honor -

- (1) High respect, as that shown for special merit; recognition or esteem.
- (2) Great privilege.
- (3) Good name; reputation.




Ephesians 6:4 (AMP)

How do fathers (and mothers) provoke their children?

- 1. Insist on a standard for their children they are not willing to practice.
- 2. Force them to be someone God has not made them.

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




²⁹After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed (ektrephō — nourish) and care for their body, just as Christ does the church—
